



Maureen Andrew Award

The Maureen Andrew award was designed to recognize an outstanding CPTHN member who demonstrates the CPTHN vision by improving the lives of children and families living with inherited and acquired disorders of clotting. The recipient must have shown an ability to embrace the philosophy of Maureen Andrew and her incredible dedication to children with thrombotic disorders.

The award was named in honour of Dr. Maureen Andrew, former leader and pioneer in pediatric thrombotic disorders and founder of the 1-800-NOCLOTS help line. Maureen worked at both the Hospital for Sick Children and McMaster and developed the pediatric hemostasis thrombosis programs at both centers. She was a woman who changed the field and the way physicians practice. She was a mentor to students, physicians, and nurses wanting to learn about childhood thromboembolism.

The Maureen Andrew Award will be awarded every 2 years by the CPTHN at the annual general meeting.

- To nominate a CPTHN member for this award, a 2-page letter should be sent to the admin@cpthn.ca by March 15, 2023.
- The letter should state why that particular member is deserving of the award specifically indicating the accomplishments (clinical, educational, mentorship and research) of the member with respect to pediatric thrombosis.
- The Vice-Chair together with the Executive and the Members of the Thrombosis Committee of the CPTHN will review the nominations and will vote and decide by March 31, 2023. Any member with a conflict of interest (works in same institution as a nominee) will abstain from the vote.
- The successful nominee will be notified by April 3, 2023, and invited to attend the CPTHN annual meeting on May 4th, in Niagara Falls, ON where he/she will be asked to provide a 15-20 minute presentation on their career highlighting their work in pediatric thrombosis. Their expenses to attend the AGM will be covered by the CPTHN.
- An award (plaque and gift) will be presented to the recipient following the presentation.
