



CPTHN SUMMER STUDENT SCHOLARSHIPS

For a third consecutive year, the Canadian Pediatric Thrombosis & Hemostasis Network will financially support interested Canadian Undergraduate trainees to work for up to 4 months during the Summer of 2024 on a research project in the field of Hemostasis or Thrombosis.

Stipend: Up to \$5,000 each (including travel fees to present the results at CPTHN; no additional funding support for travel and accommodations will be provided.).

The number of scholarships awarded will depend on funding and the number and quality of applications received.

Who can apply?

- Medical students in any year of training.
- Science students in any year of an undergraduate program.
- Applicants must be Canadian citizens or permanent residents.
- Supervisors must hold active CPTHN membership.

How to apply?

- Submit the following to the CPTHN office via email at admin@cpthn.ca by 11:59 pm PST on **January 26, 2024**:
 - Two-page project proposal (12 font, single-spaced, excluding references), including the following sections: Background, Rationale, Aims, Methods, and Expected Impact
 - 150-word lay description of research proposal and impact (for posting on the CPTHN website)
 - CV of the trainee
 - CV of the supervisor

Evaluation: Applications will be reviewed by an independent peer review committee composed of CPTHN members. The scientific merit of the proposal and its feasibility along with the applicant and supervisor's credentials will be taken into consideration for awarding the scholarship. The names of the successful applicants will be announced by **March 15, 2024**.

Grant Payment: Full Payment is normally made to the financial officer of the host institution at the start of the scholarship term. The host institution will be responsible for issuing a T4A.

Please note that research grants disbursed from Canadian Pediatric Thrombosis and Hemostasis Network (CPTHN) are intended to be used for research purposes only, and not institutional overhead costs. While we recognize that these may be legitimate expenditures, we believe the funding of such costs is the responsibility of governments and not for not-for-profit organizations.

Final Reporting Requirements: The student is expected to present his project at the 2025 CPTHN meeting on May 2, 2025. For any future presentation or publication of the research, the support of CPTHN should be acknowledged.
